Minister's Corner Minister Sarah Caine

As I write this, snow is steadily falling, but just yesterday I was walking around in short sleeves. From those few days of heat and sunshine, I gained renewed energy and hope. This month's themes are "Faith" and "Hope"... or is it "Faith and Hope"? These two things are

connected, as is much of life, but not exclusively so.

Faith is a hot topic, and it only takes a peek at history to know it always has been. (The Crusades, anyone? How about the Inguisition?) Right now, there is a strange and insidious movement for using "Freedom of Religion" as a mode of oppression. Faith is being defined by a small group of anti-LGBTQ+, anti-choice, usually white, usually upper middle class, people who hide under the title of Christian. This potential legislative protection for doctors who refuse care of trans patients, adoption agencies that refuse to allow LGBTQ+ parents to care for the vulnerable children who need them, employers who can take away medical care for people who use health coverage to receive birth control is dangerous and counter to our faith as UUs. Our faith calls for us to recognize the inherent worth and dignity of each person, allow them to use their voice for a vote in their lives, and to strive for justice, compassion, and equity in human relations. If these laws go into place, what happens to our faith? Where would our religious freedom be? Deporting immigrants, refusing refugees, these are directly counter to the commands of multiple traditions.

So we must use our faith. Use it as a source of strength.

Use our voice as people of faith, and reclaim the space that has been taken from us. Do not let others define who you are.

That is the Hope. The hope of progressive, inclusive, loving faith. Not just ours, but Pagans, Christians, Jews, Muslims, Hindus, Buddhists, and all who answer the call of Love. Those who use their faith to open their minds and hearts are the Hope.

May we find the Hope we need in times of trial. May we bring Faith so others may have it. Blessed be. Amen.

The RE Coordinator is a new posi-



All Souls Care Team A Call for CareMeals

Submitted by Mark Sanderson Members and Friends of All Souls, Our Care Team has a mission – "Working with [our] minister, team members will provide caring needs to

members and friends who are facing isolation, personal tragedies, bereavement, or various health conditions... celebrating the joyful events, and grieving the painful events."

We need your help in this mission. We are gathering home-cooked meals, to be frozen, and ready to give to members and friends who may be celebrating...or grieving.

Here is what we need:

- Pint-sized or quart-sized freezer quality containers with complete nutritious meals – soups, goulashes, chili, or Grandma's creative family dish – a meal that can be thawed, heated, and eaten. Or one portion of an entrée meal – meat, vegetable, carbohydrate, or dessert.
- Donate your own container or pick up a container provided by the Care Team on the display table in Eliza's Kitchen.
- Label the container: ingredients (at least name common allergens and if it is meat-based, vegetarian, or vegan), date cooked/baked, any special instructions for reheating (simpler is better), and perhaps a message, ie., "Enjoy," with your name (name optional).
- Return your frozen contribution to the church... to the freezer section of our refrigerator. Or contact and deliver to a Care Team member – Mark Sanderson, Marsha Vickland, or Minister Sarah Caine.

Then rest easy, knowing that you helped a member of our community in time of need.

Facilities Team Minutes Projects Planned for 2017 Submitted by Sue Ann Lang

Minutes of Facilities Team meeting

February 6, 2017: A welcome and Chalice lighting at 6 pm was followed by brief check-in by Sue Ann Lang; chair, Joy Hembel; and Paul Thompson.

An update of progress of the property management company to secure a renter was followed by work they suggested should be done to the parsonage. They include:

- Cleaning main floor shower floor and sink.
- Fix hole in wall that is at the top of basement stairs.
- Clean the bottom of dishwasher.
- Sweep the bugs off windowsills.
- It was agreed that volunteers could do this work.

The company that removes the snow from church parking lot and sidewalks does the snow removal at the parsonage. The property management agency also said smoke detectors need to be installed in each bedroom. They are purchased and in the janitors closet.

The team agreed that professionals should install the stove vent (it is already purchased and in the basement), which is to be vented to the outside, and also trim branches off the roof. It is agreed that the items in the garages need to go to Goodwill or to the trash. Volunteers can do this also.

At the church several small projects need to be done to maintain the building. They include the list below.

- Paint risers on steps both sides.
- Clean walls on stairwell.
- Bumpers on welcoming table (Paul Thompson). This will keep it from scratching the wall.
- Do touch-up painting on upstairs walls and radiators.
- Attach plastic corner protectors to radiators by front door.
- Attach corner protectors upstairs at top of stairs.
- Fix hole in carpet (Paul T.).
- Paint door leading into basement at bottom of stairs.
- Touch up painting on walls leading to boiler room.

The chair will make a list of seasonal tasks that should be done and put together supplies needed in tubs for the various tasks.

There is a plan to wax social hall floor in May in order to maintain its surface.

There was a very short discussion on who is purchasing and filling paper supplies used in bathrooms and kitchen. Chair to follow-up.

Adjourned at 7 pm.

This month we will be highlighting our minister, Sarah Caine, who joined us officially on November 1 of 2016!

Sarah was introduced to UU at 9 years old. She found that the faith of UUs resonated with her morality. The experience of soul-enriching worship, connected her to amazing friendships and also to meaning for her life, including working in ministry.

Sarah was born and raised in Ridgecrest, CA, til 8, then spent a year in Virginia that was a part of the trajectory of a life path in UU faith. She spent a year in California, MD. It wasn't until settling in Tucson, AZ, that Sarah found the place she considers her hometown. She lived in Tucson until moving to Los Angeles her third year of university. Following college, Sarah taught English in South Korea for a year. After bouncing back to the US, Sarah felt the call to ministry and attended seminary in Berkeley. After a year in residence at Starr King, Sarah spent a year working and living in Davis, CA, while commuting to the Bay Area for some classes. The year before moving to Sioux Falls was spent back in the L.A. area.

Sarah's family is her 15-year-old cat, Kida, a very vocal calico who shares many opinions on life and assists in service writing. Sarah is close to her siblings: a younger brother, Anthony, lives in Oxnard, CA, and is a mathematician; a younger sister, Derussa, who lives near Portland and is in school for nursing while working as a CNA. They try to see each other as often as possible. Sarah is also hoping to add a rescue dog to her family soon!

At All Souls, Sarah attends the Journey meetings, and when we break out into the Worship, RE, and Social Justice committees, she will attend all of those. As a part of the ministry, she serves on the Board, and she really enjoys the satisfaction of being able to help an institution run well.

The volunteer work that Sarah is involved in is in the beginning stages. Since moving to Sioux Falls, she has

connected with activist groups. She attended the Pro-Choice Lobby Day in Pierre on Feb. 21. She hopes that helping with the Social Justice committee will provide more opportunities like helping at The Banquet, as well as possibilities of tutoring programs or park clean up.

The values that guide Sarah's life are Justice, Compassion, Art, Friendships, and pausing to be heart-full or mindful of the moment. Her values also include Love,

which means in the big sense of loving your neighbor as yourself, loving ourselves and including the planet.

The passions that keep her life full are Brazilian Jiu Jitsu and Muay Thai, which fills as much free time as she can spare. She would love to take a weekly dance class, as dancing is something that helped her through high school and it just happens all the time informally.
