Minister's Corner Minister Sarah Caine

May's worship themes are Belonging and Interconnection. This comes at a time when the UUA is in leadership transition and the denomination at large is taking some time for self-reflection and examining internalized, unconscious racism—specifically the ways that White Supremacy is reflected in

small actions by generally good people who aren't members of hate groups. It can be a painful conversation for people of color in our movement who have dealt with this through out their lives, and an uncomfortable one for white folks who haven't dug into the topic much before. Knowing ourselves is key in understanding how we're interconnected, how we belong, and how we effect the sense of belonging with others.

Improved Church Website and Monthly Newsletter Changes


The All Souls website is getting a makeover. Ready to launch the first week in May, the new design has been six months in the making.

Minister Sarah of All Souls will lead this first session with the hope that we can trade practices each month. Explore and find something that reconnects and centers you for the upcoming month.




Adult RE May 10 at 6pm Last Class of the Social Justice Series

Carnes of Sierra Club To Speak on May 7

Morgan Carnes of the Sierra Club will speak at the May 7 worship at 10am on enlisting humanity to protect and restore the quality of the natural and human environment.

Morgan Carnes is the Chair of the South Dakota Sierra Club Executive

Committee. Sierra Club is our nation's oldest environmental organization. Founded by John Muir in 1892, the organization was formed to protect the Sierra Nevada, establish national parks, and get people outdoors to explore and protect wild places. Today Sierra Club's Mission is "To explore, enjoy, and protect the wild places of the earth; To practice and promote the responsible use of the earth's ecosystems and resources; To educate and enlist humanity to protect and restore the quality of the natural and human environment; and to use all lawful means to carry out these objectives." In 2014, the national Board of Directors adopted an initiative to build Sierra Club into a more inclusive, just, and equitable organization. We will talk about what this initiative means as well as the unspoken portion of Sierra Club's mission: what it means to "enlist humanity to protect and restore the quality of the natural and human environment," and how we can be active participants in this process in all that we do.

In Remembrance Barbara Goodyear

Barbara Goodyear, 1938 - 2017

Barbara "Bobbie" Goodyear, 78, died peacefully in her sleep on April 2, 2017 at Luther Manor, in Sioux Falls, South Dakota.

Bobbie was a teacher and, not on purpose, without trying, a poet, fem-

inist and philosopher. Every conversation with Bobbie involved a contemplative question and a gentle inquiry into the nature of the world around her. She started teaching at age 19 and was a mentor, second mother and inspiration to three generations of kids. Well into her '70s, Bobbie couldn't go anywhere in Sioux Falls without being stopped by former students, ready to share their news with her.

Bobbie was very involved in local organizations, volunteering to rock babies in the neonatal ward, serving meals at the Banquet, and tutoring students. An ardent supporter of the arts, she loved attending community concerts, art openings, and touring shows at the Pavilion. Bobbie also served as president of the All Souls Church.

Bobbie grew up in Finley, North Dakota, the fourth of five children of George and Lillian Strand. Before moving into town, they lived on a farm and she attended a one-room schoolhouse. After graduating from Finley High and receiving a teaching degree from Valley City Teachers College, she taught sixth grade for her entire career. Later, she completed her master's degree at the University of South Dakota. In Sioux Falls, she taught at Franklin and Horace Mann Elementary Schools and at Patrick Henry Middle School.

Bobbie is preceded in death by her parents George and Lillian Strand and her sisters Lucille Little and Katherine Pence. She is survived by her two brothers Owen Strand of Anoka, Minnesota and Benton Strand of Fargo, North Dakota, her son Jason Goodyear of Santa Fe, New Mexico and her daughter Leslie Goodyear and son-in-law Dan Janis of Boston, Massachusetts.

Although her family lived far from Sioux Falls, Bobbie was surrounded by many loving, supportive, amazing, long-time friends who were the core of her Sioux Falls community. Together with the wonderful teams Touchmark at All Saints and Luther Manor, these friends cared for her with joy and love and helped to ease her struggle with Alzheimer's Disease.

A memorial service will be held at a later date so that the celebration of Bobbie's life can include as many family members, friends and those whose lives were touched by Bobbie as possible. Announcements will be forthcoming. In lieu of flowers, and because she was such a supporter of the arts and science, and education in all forms, memorials in Bobbie's name may be made to Washington Pavilion in Sioux Falls.



Citizens' Climate Lobby Monday, May 15 • 7pm


Citizens Climate Lobby will meet on Monday, May 15, at 7:00 p.m. at All Souls Church.

Everyone is warmly welcome to come and practice! Any free-will donation is accepted to help cover travel expenses for the monks .


